Idiom: A group of words or a phrase whose meaning is not meant to be understood literally.
Example: Sarah! You scared the pants off me!

Onomatopoeia: A word that mimics the sound of the object or action being referred to.
Example: The switch sizzled at my feet.

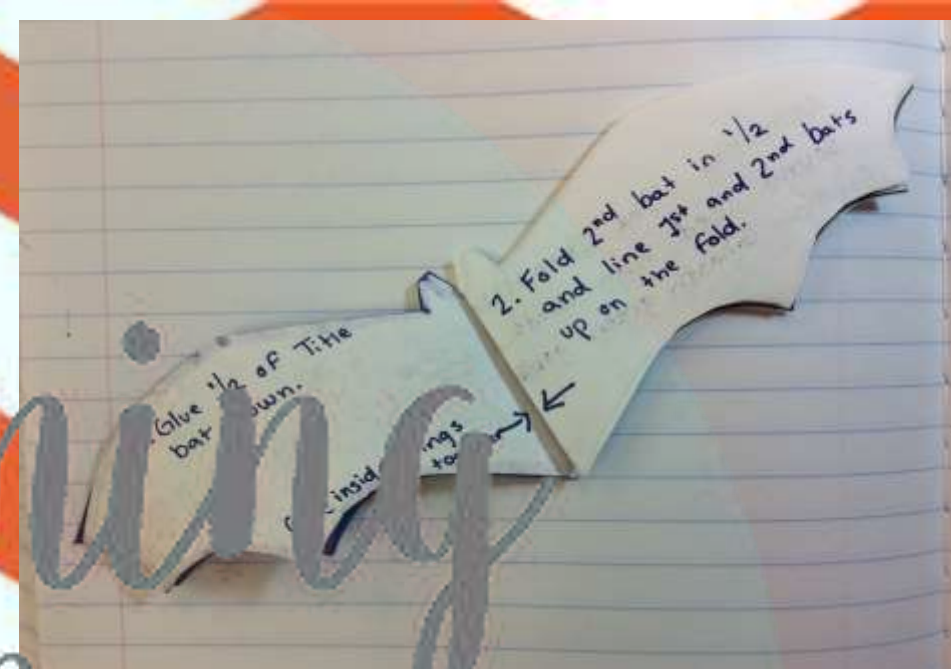
Hyperbole: An extreme exaggeration that is way it could possibly be true.
Example: It felt like I had been screaming for 1,000 years.

Personification: Giving human like qualities to non-human things.
Example: The Jack-o-Lantern winked at me!

Metaphor: A comparison of two unlike things using the words like or as.
Example: My mom is a wizard in the kitchen.

Simile: A comparison of two unlikely things using the words like or as.
Example: The pumpkin glowed like a sunset.

Alliteration: The repetition of the same letter or sound used with words close together.
Example: Ghastly green goblins gasped in the graveyard.



Figurative Language

Alliteration: The use of the same letter or sound used several times together.
Example: Gaspard gasped in the graveyard.
