While reading, active readers are constantly making predictions. A prediction is an educated guess about what will happen next in the text, based on clue and the reader's schema, (background knowledge). This good guess can be based on a title, illustrations, text, or even your own ideas! An active reader can back up every prediction with evidence. When you are making predictions you are acting like a reading detective, looking for clues and trying to decipher what they mean.

ACTIVE READERS MAKE PREDICTIONS:

- ✓ **Before Reading:** Title, chapter heading, blurb, illustrations...etc.
- ✓ **During Reading:** Stop and predict what will happen next,
- ✓ **After Reading:** React! Were you right or do you need to adjust your reactions.
