I have my students begin with a practice page. I simply print this on regular printer paper. I explain that the students can choose to either ignore the ridlines and create one large picture, or they can treat each uare as an individual canvas.


I print the final page, on art paper, or white construction paper. This paper seems to absorb the ink better. However, regular printing paper will work great. I pair this page double sided. One side has the blark gid, the oner side includes the numbers. Students then complete their design. I encourage students to try and use an equal amount of ink compared to white space. The black ink shows through the tissue paper best, and really creates the WOW effect. I have often sent students back add more black to their page when they thought they were finished. I have black all point pens, regular tips sheet, and fire point sheet are not students of the point sheet.

After, the squares have been cut out, the students will use the numbers on the other side to place their squares on a new piece of colored paper. Once the spacing is correct I then let my students glue the squares down.
